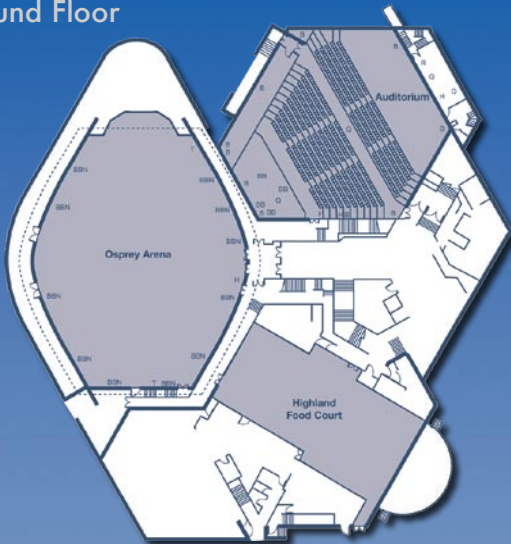

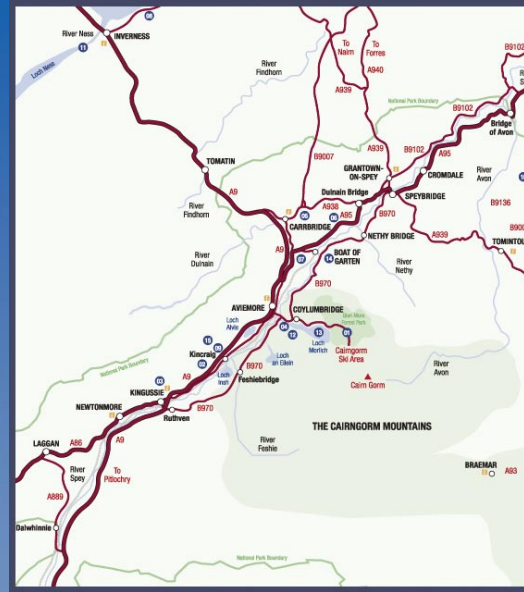
Upper Floor

DIRECTIONS



By Road:

From North (Inverness)
 Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn right at T junction and follow road through Aviemore village. Turn right (2nd exit) at first roundabout into the Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort and follow signs to Reception.

From South (Glasgow, Edinburgh and Perth)
 Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn left at T junction and follow road into Aviemore village. Immediately after Esso garage on right, turn left into Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort. (first exit on completion of roundabout at this junction) and follow signs to Reception

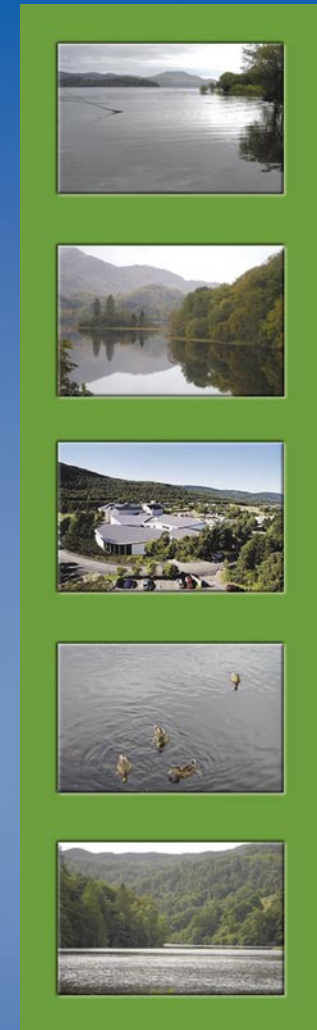
By Bus:

Terminal 200 meters away from resort. (coaches from London (12 hrs) Edinburgh 2 1/2 hrs) & Glasgow 3 hrs).

By Rail:

Aviemore Main Line Railway station just 200 metres away from resort with direct services from London Kings Cross, Edinburgh, Glasgow etc.

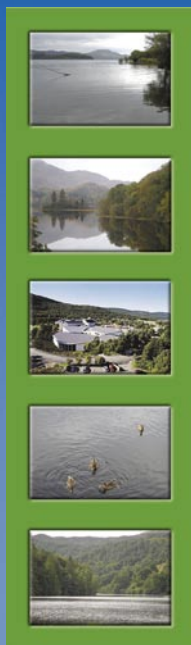

As the CWW Planning Group we see ourselves in the role of motivating and modelling opportunities for church leaders to get together and network and inspire each other with stories of hope and renewal, and give support to those who are willing to begin to push the boat out a bit further.

So now that Christmas is over - just think how much you'd appreciate having a break in the middle of March. A chance to recharge your batteries before all the additional preparation at Easter. The CWW Planning Group has organised a conference and we'd love as many ministers and church leaders to come and attend.

Aim:

As part of the process of celebrating Church without Walls and evaluating the progress of its implementation, the conference will aim to provide, in a relaxed and comfortable setting, an opportunity for ministers and other congregational motivators to engage with the four main themes of the report and in the process have their own vision and energy renewed. The conference throughout will attempt to model what it means to be a Church without Walls.

The first 450 who sign up will be in for a wonderful three days. Unfortunately we can only take 2 from each congregation and we have a limited 450 places.

This initiative is made possible through the generous help of Macdonald Hotels and participants will only be asked to contribute a fraction of the cost.

Participants:

Churches are invited to send their minister and one other motivational member of their congregation to take part in this event.

Speakers include:



Rev. John Bell is an ordained minister of the Church of Scotland and a Member of the Iona Community.

John has produced (some in collaboration with Graham Maule), many collections of original hymns and songs and two collections of songs of the World Church. He is

an occasional broadcaster, lectures in theological colleges in Britain and U.S., but is primarily concerned with the renewal of congregational worship at grass roots level.



Dr Elaine Storkey is one of the most experienced writers and speakers in relating the Christian Gospel to contemporary culture. She has a background in philosophy and sociology and has many years experience of teaching in the UK and overseas. Her most recent publication, with the University of

Salford, addresses issues of helping business leaders explore and apply Christian ethics in their work.



Rev. Kenny Borthwick is the minister of Holy Trinity Wester Hailes, Edinburgh. He is a well know conference speaker and is one of the key leaders involved with organising the CLAN gatherings, a christian conference which attracts over 3000 participants for a wide number of denominations each year.

Kenny started his ministry in the Islands and has also spent 14 years in Thurso as a parish minister. He has a vast experience to share and will bring a fascinating insight into the CWW theme.

These will be the keynote speakers dealing with the main themes of the CWW report.

Theme of the Main Conference Sessions:

Using the four New Testament gospels, the conference will help to illuminate the four main themes of the Church without Walls Report concerning the shape of the church, and will provide a basis for ministers and other congregational leaders to review and re-energise their own vision.

The four main themes of the report are:

- A Church shaped by – The Gospel (Exploring the themes of Law and Grace in Matthew's Gospel) - Keynote speaker Elaine Storkey
- A Church shaped by – The Neighbourhood (Exploring the theme of the "Word made flesh" in John's Gospel) - Keynote speaker John Bell
- A Church shaped by – Friendship (Exploring the theme of the vulnerable outsider in Luke's Gospel) - Keynote speaker TBC
- A Church shaped by – The Gifts of God's People (Exploring the themes of discipleship in Mark's Gospel) - Keynote speaker Kenny Borthwick

The central theme running through the whole programme will be the Grace of God and "the cycle of grace" will be explored in the opening session.

There will be opportunities for reflection and relaxation as well as the chance to share one another's stories and expertise, and to build supportive networks with one another.



The Right Reverend David Lacy, current Moderator of the General Assembly, will also be in attendance, sharing and conducting worship.
