## By Road

*From the North (Inverness)*

Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn right at T-junction and follow road through Aviemore village. Turn right (2nd exit) at first roundabout into the Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort and follow signs to Reception.

*From the South (Glasgow, Edinburgh and Perth)*

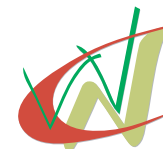
Leave A9 as signposted for Aviemore (B970), turn left at T-junction and follow road into Aviemore village. Immediately after Esso garage on right, turn left into Macdonald Aviemore Highland Resort (first exit on completion of roundabout at this junction) and follow signs to Reception.

## By Bus

Terminal 200 metres away from resort. Coaches from London (12 hrs) Edinburgh (2 1/2 hrs) and Glasgow (3 hrs).

## By Rail

Aviemore Main Line Railway station just 200 metres away from resort with direct services from London Kings Cross, Edinburgh, Glasgow etc.

Scotland recently has been highlighted as having one of the highest incidents of violence among adolescents and we are among the highest statistics when it comes to family break-ups. ### Motivators

The General Assembly has endorsed the work of CWW for the past six years, and the Assembly of 2007 urged all congregations and councils to engage with CWW, especially in taking advantage of the conferences held at Aviemore. **Tommy MacNeil** is a Church of Scotland minister based in Stornoway, Isle of Lewis. He is a trustee of the Scottish Bible Society, and is a member of the Scottish council of the Evangelical Alliance. Tommy was previously minister in Barvas, Isle of Lewis

where his ministry was richly blessed. He is now minister of Martin's Memorial church where they are experiencing church growth in every area of their work. He has a passion for the Church in Scotland to become all that God has destined us to be.



**Richard Hardy** is the Church and Community Development Manager for Care for the Family. He is involved in assisting churches to determine how they might serve their communities on the family agenda and in supporting church leaders in their personal

lives. Richard has had many roles in Church leadership over the past 20 years and has been Pastor of Tangier Road Baptist Church in Portsmouth for the last 14 years.



**Kathleen Marshall** became Scotland's first Commissioner for Children and Young People in April 2004. She promotes and safeguards the rights of children and young people in Scotland. Kathleen qualified as a solicitor in 1975. Subsequently she has

specialised in child law and is Visiting Professor at the Glasgow Centre for the Child and Society at the University of Glasgow.
